How your fundraising helps – Ida's story.

Being the only deaf child at my school was hard. I felt quite alone. I was studying languages, but found it difficult to hear the listening parts of the course. This made me upset and I felt like I couldn't pick a language as a GCSE option.

The National Deaf Children's Society helped me understand my rights – before I didn't know much about the support I could get as a deaf young person.

Dad spoke to the NDCS Helpline. They sent us lots of info about the support I was entitled to when studying. My French teachers now speak the words for listening tests so I can lipread them. This has really helped. I feel a lot happier now I understand what support I can have at school.

This October we have two exciting half marathons that you can sign up to and join #teamNDCS to support deaf young people and their families.

Whether you're new to running or looking to achieve your PB the Wiggle Manchester Half Marathon is the race for you! Join 14,000 runners of all abilities and run the North West's biggest event. The event is 13.1 miles of flat closed road, starting and finishing at the Emirates Old Trafford. Perfect for new or experienced runners!

We also have places for the prestigious autumnal Royal Parks Half Marathon. This isn't just any half marathon. Famous for it's beautiful route, you will get a chance to run 13.1 miles past the capital's iconic landmarks and parks. All roads will be closed on the day and you will run through four out of eight royal parks – Hyde Park, Green Park, St James Park and Kensington Garden.

How do I get involved?

- £12.50 can give a family, who have just found out that their baby is deaf, 20 minutes of free, confidential support through our Helpline.
- £60 could enable a deaf child to borrow a digital streamer from the National Deaf Children's Society that will help them to listen to the TV and music, use the phone and have a conversation in a noisy place for the first time.
- £200 could enable a deaf child to borrow a radio aid system from NDCS that will help them hear better in a noisy classroom or an after-school club.
- £500 will give a deaf child the chance to go on a weekend event, where they can make friends, gain confidence and be included in the same way as any other child.
