Presenter volunteers are an essential part of our events for **reaching different communities**. We have day and weekend events within the UK. You will **give presentations** about **what we do and our services** for deaf children, young people and their families, and **deaf awareness**. You may be on your own or part of a team. You therefore need to be **enthusiastic** and **engaging**!

### About you

- Aged 18 years or over
- Willing to deliver presentations to a range of audiences in community venues including schools, community centres and other organisations
- Personal experiences of deafness, either as a deaf person or raising a deaf child, is beneficial but not essential
- Willing to travel within the UK

### What you will do

- Deliver presentations effectively
- Present us in a positive way
- Adapt your presentation style to meet the needs of the audience
- Inspire communities to support us
- Be responsible for the quality of your volunteering and for yourself as part of a team
- Follow policies relevant to your role

### When you can volunteer

- Events take place during the day, evenings and weekends as a one-off or regular occurrence

### Training

Before volunteering within this role, you need to attend a 'Being a Presenter' training event. Topics covered include:

- Presentation skills and practice
- Communication and Deaf Awareness
- Informed Choice
- Safeguarding and Child Protection
